Duke W for an excellent week, following instruction during rebound therapy and for super reading.



**Nursery 1** Welcome back for our last half term! Nursery 1 have all bounced back to school full of mischief and cant wait to get stuck into our new topic "Sensory Journeys". **Nursery 2** This week Nursery 2 has been looking at the sensory story 'The Train Ride', looking at lots of different types of trains. We have also made cinnamon bread wheels in cooking.



**Whitelow 1** This week we have enjoyed exploring our new topic Sensory Journeys. We have been out and about in the local environment, where we have used our senses to investigate the sights, sounds and smells as we travelled through Radcliffe Town Centre. We visited the local Church, where we looked closely at the different shapes we



could see in the architecture and the beautiful stained glass windows. We also walked to the ceno-taph. We ventured to the local supermarket. We purchased ingredients for our food technology session, in preparation for our train cake bake.

**Whitelow 2** This week in Whitelow 2 we have been creating our own musical instruments to make music to accompany a train ride. We have looked at tiny



cress seeds and watched them change as they germinated and grew. We went on mini-adventures in the school grounds, looking at the symbols on the map to show where we were. Busy times, and lots of fun.



**Redvales 1** have had a lovely first week back. We have been making lots of natural art using things that we find in our school grounds. First we made map sticks mapping a walk and we put them all together in a display. Then we all selected natural things to go on our light table to make a lovely whole-class piece of art. We've all enjoyed exploring our natural finds.



**Redvales 2** We have had a lovely first week back! This half term our topic is called "Healthy Me". We have enjoyed our story "The Runaway Pizza"! We have been designing and choosing toppings to make our own pizzas! We have also been designing pebbles to make a whole-school painted pebble path. We can't wait to see it finished.



**Redvales 3** This week in Redvales 3 we have been developing our skills about having an opinion, through reading the story of Puss in Boots. We have enjoyed working on measurement in Maths and have been looking at converting from centimetres to millimetres, and inches to feet. We have been having lots of fun practising our sing-



ing, signing and dancing for the performance at The Lowry. In Science we have made welly planters and are going to observe how long it takes for the seeds to grow, recording our results in a graph.



**Redvales 4** This week Redvales 4 have been doing some RE work. We listened to the story of creation. We gathered plants, grass and soil to make our own garden. We used different materials to make our own models of Adam and Eve.



**Redvales 5** have had a fantastic week. We visited Manchester Airport and were so lucky to see so many airplanes setting off on their journeys. Eva waved at the pilot in one plane and he waved back. We also released how loud airplanes are when we are so close.



**Redvales 6** have had a fabulous first week back at school! In History we have been looking at photographs and sharing experiences of the children at various stages in their lives, for example, baby, toddler and first day at school. In P.E. we have been practising hard for next week's Sports Day and also done some fantastic communication with our friends.



**Irwell 1** have been enjoying exploring different stories this week. We have been looking at a range of fiction books as well as learning about The Very Hungry Caterpillar. We have been sequencing the story and matching the different fruits. We liked sharing our stories with each other.



**Irwell 2** In English we have been learning all about different animals to explore new words. In Maths we have been using the animals to help us count and add up.



**Irwell 3** This week in Irwell 3 we have been exploring different musical instruments and music. We have been
